OUR MISSION

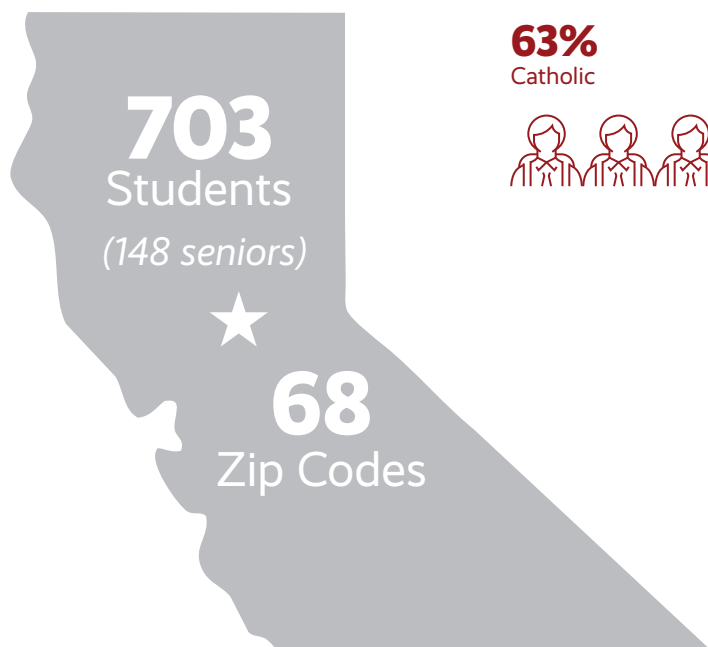

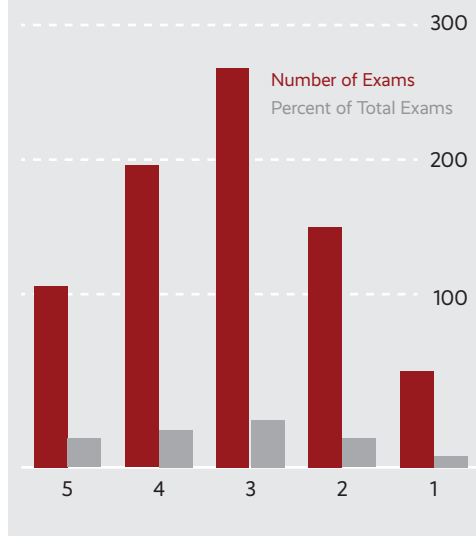
