### ARTS COURSES

#### ART 1

June 16 - July 3	8:00-1:00 PM
9th-12th grades	\$470
Prerequisite: None	No Book Required

This semester introductory survey course is the prerequisite for all year long visual art classes: Digital Photo, Painting, and Sculpture. Students are introduced to the visual arts through instruction in drawing, sculpture, architecture, painting, and art history. This course focuses on the elements of art through hands-on experience. **5 credits**

#### PAINTING 1, SESSION 1

June 7 - July 3	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
9th-12th grades	\$480
Prerequisite: Art 1	No Book Required

#### PAINTING 1, SESSION 2

July 7 - July 25	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
9th-12th grades	\$480
Prerequisite: Art 1	No Book Required

This course introduces students to the basic materials, painting techniques and skills used in painting and are designed to develop student's observation, imagination, and creativity through artistic expression. Using the vocabulary of visual arts, students will also gain the ability to analyze and respond to various works, including their own. Through critiques, students will display the ability to aesthetically value and appreciate works of art, as well as understand the relationship between art, culture and history. This semester course, when taken with Painting 2, fulfills the SF and UC Fine Arts requirement. **5 credits**

#### PAINTING 2

July 7 - July 25	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
9th-12th grades	\$480
Prerequisite: Painting 1	No Book Required

Students further their understanding of painting techniques. They learn to express themselves through their own creative paintings and through critiques. Students analyze various artists' works as well as their own. Through critiques, students continue to appreciate works of art, as well as understand the relationship between art, culture and history. This semester course fulfills the SF and UC Fine Arts requirement. UC/CSU approved. **5 credits**

### SCIENCE COURSES

#### BIOLOGY

June 16 - July 25	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
10th-12th grades	\$750
Prerequisite: None	Book Required

This course is designed to teach the student the basic concepts necessary for investigating and understanding living organisms, with an emphasis on the interrelationships between organisms and their environment. Students develop a concept of the unique characteristics common to all living organisms, and are presented with a background in cellular and molecular biology, genetics, evolution, and ecology. While covering the kingdoms of life, the concept of increasing complexity and organization is developed through a study of structure and function, with emphasis on human physiology. Lots of great hands-on lab work! UC/CSU approved. **10 credits**

#### CHEMISTRY

June 16 - July 25	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
10th-12th grades	\$750
Prerequisite: Biology	Book required

This course is designed to teach the fundamental principles of chemistry and to prepare students for physical science classes on high school and university levels. The class stresses basic problem solving techniques and understanding the major theories in chemistry through written and lab work. Chemistry is an experimental science so students will have lots of hands-on learning in the SF science labs! UC/CSU approved. **10 credits**

# MATH COURSES

## ALGEBRA 1 REVIEW, SESSION 1

June 16 - July 3	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
9th-12th grades	\$400
Prerequisite: None	No Book Required

## ALGEBRA 1 REVIEW, SESSION 2

July 7 - July 25	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
9th-12th grades	\$400
Prerequisite: None	No Book Required

This course is suitable (upon recommendation from the Assistant Principal for Academics) for some incoming freshmen who will be enrolling in Geometry as a freshman, or for a current freshmen rising to sophomore year who are in need of some additional preparation prior to enrolling in Geometry in the fall. **0 Credit**

## ALGEBRA 2

June 16 - July 25	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
10th-12th grades	\$750
Prerequisite: Algebra 1	No Book required

This course is the standard second year course in Algebra. Students must have received a B or better in Algebra 1 to take this class. Basic concepts are extended to include three-dimensional systems and their solutions; also developed are functions, relations, irrational and complex numbers, conics, exponential functions, log functions, and sequences and series. UC/CSU approved. **10 credits**

## GEOMETRY

June 16 - July 25	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
10th-12th grades	\$750
Prerequisite: Algebra 1	Book required

The course continues to review basic Algebra skills, but focuses on completing the state standards for Geometry. Major topics include geometric proofs, properties of parallel and perpendicular lines, congruent triangles, basic properties and area and volume of two-dimensional and three-dimensional figures, similarity and proportions, basic trigonometric functions, constructions, and coordinate Geometry. UC/CSU approved. **10 credits**

# SOCIAL STUDIES COURSES

## CIVICS/ECONOMICS

June 16 - July 25	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
12th grade	\$750
Prerequisite: U. S. History	Book required

Civics and Economics analyzes government and politics in the United States and enables students to use economic concepts in a reasoned and careful manner in dealing with the personal, community and national economic issues students confront or will confront. The course examines the philosophical and constitutional bases of U.S. government, economy and the beliefs and behaviors of citizens. This class fulfills the senior year Social Studies requirement. UC/CSU approved. **10 credits**

## WORLD GEOGRAPHY, SESSION 1

June 13 - July 3 -	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
9th grade	\$400
Prerequisite: None	Book Required

## WORLD GEOGRAPHY, SESSION 2

July 7 - July 23	8:00 AM-1:00 PM
9th grade	\$400
Prerequisite: None	Book Required

This beginning social sciences course serves as the first semester of a three semester World History survey. Students develop geographic literacy and ability to link geography and its effect on human culture, with an emphasis on non-western history and culture. Students learn map reading as well as research and writing skills, while developing an empathetic socio-economic awareness of non-western culture. There is a special emphasis on the interpretation of history as a universal discipline. UC/CSU approved. **5 credits**

## DRIVER EDUCATION

Prerequisite: None	No Book Required

## DRIVER EDUCATION

June 2 - June 12	12: 00- 3:15 PM
15 years old	\$110
Prerequisite: None	No Book Required

This course is designed to help the student become a responsible driver who is well aware of and better able to manage the risks of distracted driving. With this goal in mind, responsible driving also addresses such issues as resisting harmful peer pressure and social pressure, exercising emotional control, and developing social responsibility. Course includes 26 hour class time and 4 hours of independent study; 30 hours total for course completion in compliance with DMV regulations. Students who successfully complete this course will receive a certificate of completion and will be eligible to take the permit test. You must be 15 ½ years old to take the CA permit test and 15 to take this class. **0 Credit**

Students assess their current lifestyle choices and set personal goals aimed at improving their quality of life. Students learn to identify teenage health risks, and investigate health issues and health related careers. In addition, they research health risks created by poverty, domestic violence and child abuse. This is a required course for graduation from SF. UC/CSU approved. **5 credits**

## Summer School Policies and Procedures

### General Policies

All rules and regulations of St. Francis High School are in effect during the summer sessions. Infractions (e.g. dress code or phone violations, tardiness – see [Student Parent Handbook](#) on the St. Francis website) may result in detentions being issued. Students who receive three or more detentions may be asked to leave summer school with no credit and no refund.

### Dress Code

Our summer school dress code is casual and comfortable. Students are expected to dress in clean, decent attire. No hats are to be worn in the classroom. Tank tops, sports shorts, crop tops, bathing suits and clothing with inappropriate language are not acceptable. Shorts and tops must be modest. Shorts should be no shorter than 3 inches above the knee. Tops must cover the back and stomach.

### Supervision

St. Francis High School is not responsible for supervision of students outside of class time, this includes lunch breaks.

### Attendance

Attendance is taken daily. If a student is absent, parents are to call the Summer Session Attendance Office at 916-737-5050 before 9:00AM on the day of the absence to advise the school of the reason for the absence. Students enrolled in credit courses may not miss more than 1 day during each 3-week session or semester if they wish to be granted credit for the course. The campus is closed on July 4, 2014.

### Tuition Policy

Tuition cost for each camp or course is indicated by camp/course description. Our online registration process requires payment by credit card at the time of registration. To make alternate payment arrangements, please call 916-737-5040. If paying by check, 1/2 tuition is due with registration and the other half is due 30 days after registration or by June 1, 2014, whichever comes first.

Cancellation Policy: A full refund, less \$25 per camp or \$50 per course will be issued if cancelled by May 15, 2014, after which time a full refund will be issued only if the course/camp is cancelled by St. Francis High School.

Students will be denied class admission if tuition is unpaid. St. Francis High School reserves the right to cancel classes that do not have sufficient enrollment. Classes will be filled on a first come, first serve basis. St. Francis students have priority admission to academic courses. Class rosters will be posted at the front of the school on the first day of the class.

### Books

If there is a required book, it is indicated on the course description. Hardbound, eBooks, eBook links will be available on May 10. Although books can be purchased through any vendor, the ISBN and edition must match exactly. Students are responsible for purchasing textbooks and/or materials required for all classes, including pens, pencils, paper and notebooks.

In those classes with limited enrollment, students who are NOT accepted into the Summer School Program will be notified prior to the first day of class.

**iPad Policy**

All SFHS students, including incoming freshmen taking academic courses, are required to pick up their iPads from SFHS during the week of June 9-13<sup>th</sup> between 8:00am – 3:00pm.

All non-SFHS students taking academic courses who wish to rent an SFHS iPad will also be required to pick up their iPad from SFHS during the week of June 9-13<sup>th</sup> between 8:00am – 3:00pm. A \$75 deposit check or credit card hold will be needed for any student rental.

All students will be responsible for having downloaded/purchased any iBook or other materials required prior to the first day of summer school. Ordering and tutorial information will be provided at a later date.

Academic course students may take their iPads home. Camp students will utilize their iPads on campus and may take them home at the determination of the teacher.

**Cafeteria**

The St. Francis High School cafeteria will offer lunch and snack items for purchase during the summer session from 8am-1pm. Students/Campers may bring their own food and snacks which can be eaten in the cafeteria or in Serra Court at the tables provided.
