



In order to make class discussions and essay writing easier, students must obtain a personal copy of the edition of the book listed below. Please do not buy a different version or use an e-reader version.

Every student will be expected to bring her copy to class every day in the opening weeks of school.


In the first days of school, students are tested on their comprehension of the summer reading novel. In order to prepare for the objective test, students may wish to take notes on the characters and central events of the novel. The multiple choice questions are not difficult for anyone who has completed the reading. Students will also complete a short written response on the novel.

The mandatory summer reading book for English 9 is: The Secret Life of Bees, by Sue Monk Kidd, ISBN 0142001740

We encourage all students to read for pleasure on their own throughout the summer.

My SchoolBucks and Cafeteria

- Manage & add funds to your student's meal account (Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or debit cards)
- Option for automatic payments (weekly, monthly, at a specific balance)
- Review recent purchases, see current balance, receive low balance alerts
- Students cannot use cash anymore
- To add funds by check, use the drop slot in Front Office



How Do I Login to MySchoolBucks?

1. Go to **www.mySchoolBucks.com** and register for a free account (find correct St. Francis HS).


2. Activate your account and begin adding your student. You will need her student ID. Student ID in **this** system is the last 2 digits of the graduation year followed by the 3 digit ID – no dashes. For example, student ID 2018-331 would appear as 18331 in MySchoolBucks.

3. Add funds to your student's account (credit card, debit card, or electronic check). Money deposited into mySchoolBucks.com generally appears in the account within 12-24 hours.

4. Choose "Setup a payment schedule" option during the checkout to customize your account OR choose "Set It and Forget It" payment option.

5. Your student's MySchoolBucks ID (last 5 digits of her SF student ID) becomes her "Cafeteria Pin" which she enters in a keypad to purchase items at the Din Hall.

Attendance Policies

Absences: All school days are mandatory. This includes special schedule days such as, but not limited to, Orientation, St. Francis Day, & SWAP Day.

More than six days (absences) in a semester is considered excessive; it is the equivalent of missing two full weeks of class.

Whenever a student is absent, arriving late, or if she needs to leave early the parent or guardian must call the Attendance Office at **916-737-5050** by 8:00 a.m. on the day of the absence.

Students who come in late or leave early must check in and out of the attendance office during school hours. The student must sign the attendance log in the attendance office to be accounted for.

Tardy: Any student later than 15 minutes of a class is considered absent for the entire class. Students who miss less than 15 minutes are tardy. Tardies, excessive absences and failure to sign in/off campus have consequences.



Medicine on Campus / K12 Alert

- Students are allowed to carry one (1) dose (up to 4 pills) of aspirin, Tylenol, Midol, or Advil.
- Students may not carry prescription medication; however, except epi pens, insulin shots, and inhalers may be carried at all times.
- Students may not share medications at any time with any other student.
- Back ups or prescription medication should be kept in the main office.
- Medication forms must be signed for students to take prescription medications in the office.

K12 Alert

This is the automated system used to alert students/staff/parents to important information. K12 Alert is also used for emergency notification. Please do not call the school in case of an alert.

My Volunteer Program (MVP) Our families are the MVPs of St. Francis Catholic High School!

MVP is the parent volunteer service system at St. Francis Catholic High School. Every person must have their own MVP account.

- Parents perform a prescribed number of hours of service each year or pay a higher, non-participation rate of tuition.
- Parents of students in grades 9-11 perform **25** hours of volunteer service per year. Parents of students in grade 12 perform 10 hours of service.
- Single parents who are solely responsible for tuition may elect to perform 12.5 hours grades 9-11 (5 hours for grade 12).


