General Summary

What is the primary purpose of this position?

The St. Francis Catholic High School Biology and Integrated Science Teacher will be a passionate educator who is deeply committed to Catholic, faith-based education and student success. The Biology and Integrated Science Teacher is responsible for teaching high school students in biological sciences. This position focuses on teaching the study of living things, including photosynthesis, cellular respiration, cell growth and division, the fundamentals of DNA and RNA, genetics, the anatomy and physiology of the human reproductive systems. The teacher is a subject matter expert that knows how to build a positive classroom culture focused on learning, uses student learning data to drive his or her work, and delivers engaging rigorous instruction. The person in this position is expected to implement the school mission and philosophy, to follow the policies of the Diocese of Sacramento, and to adhere to the directives set by school administration. This is a part-time, 60% position.

- Communicate effectively with students, families, and colleagues;
- Collaborate with teachers and leaders to improve instructional, culture-building and leadership skills;
- Develop specific plans for substitutes as necessary;



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- Maintain grading records, record daily attendance, and complete all required record keeping as designated by administration;
- Attend all employee meetings, department meetings, collaboration meetings, and FEP/SST meetings as appropriate;
- Attend and fully engage in all professional development, staff meetings, liturgies, masses, prayer services, assemblies, homeroom duties, supervision duties, and school events such as but not limited to Catechetical training, Community Benefit, Back to School Night, Open House, Baccalaureate, Graduation.
