High school staff will select candidates for Interviews	Feb 16	3-4 students will be chosen for interviews based on the pre-application process. You will be given a pass for your interview. The interview panel will consist of 4-6 people. The panel will consist of both high school staff and Girls State representatives.
Interviews and Applicant Selection beginning the first week of February	Feb 23-24	Selected delegates and alternates will be notified via email by the Boys and Girls State Chairperson.
