

Course Registration Process

- Students will receive an email with instructions on how to input course requests into PowerSchool.
 - Feb 20-25
- You will also mark which classes you plan to take on your Course Registration Form. Review the form with your parents and have them sign it.
- Bring your signed form during Course Verification Days to the Dining Hall during your free block so a counselor can verify the courses in Powerschool.

Remember your a-g (for UC/CSU)

- (a): History/Social Science 2 years required
- (b): English 4 years required
- (c): Mathematics 3 years required, 4 years recommended
- (d): Laboratory Science 2 years required, 3 years recommended
- (e): Language other than English (LOTE) 2 years required, 3 years recommended
- (f):Visual and Performing Arts (VPA) I year required
- (g): College Preparatory Electives I year required (Interfaith Dialogue and Economics)

- Talk to current teachers, counselor, and students
- Check your emails for Course Registration information and AP/Honors Applications

AP/Honors

Students may choose 1-4 AP/Honors Courses per year. "Most rigorous" course load would be 8 AP/Honors courses during high school (some colleges ask for this information).

If you choose 4 AP/Honors Courses:

• Your Counselor will review the request and consider your academic history, outside commitments and long term goals. If concerned, they will contact you.

You should choose an AP/Honors class:

- To challenge yourself
- Preparation for college level
- Subject of interest

You should NOT choose an AP/Honors course:

- Your friend said you should
- You feel like you have to

Must apply by January 20th!

If you choose an AP/Honors course, you are making a yearlong commitment to that course.

Things to Remember

- 1. You are "requesting" courses.
- 2. You are committing to take these courses your entire senior year
 - a. There is no such thing as "trying a class"
 - b. Schedule changes will not occur after May 15th including in the summer.
 - C. Drops that occur once the school year has began result in a W on the transcript. Drops that occur after Q1 result in a WF on the transcript.
- 3. Be sure to request courses that fulfill the entrance requirements at all colleges you are considering.
 - a. Example: Santa Clara University uses the following verbiage:
 - Language Other Than English: 2 years required, 3 years recommended; 4 years preferred

Summer School

- Registration opens Feb 15th at 12:00pm
- June 12- July 21
- St. Francis Summer School Offerings (subject to change)
 - Integrated Math 2
 - **IM3** B
 - Chemistry
 - Physics
 - Driver's Education (2 weeks)

You must have a conversation with your Counselor prior to enrolling in summer school at other high schools or colleges.

Schedule Changes

- Reasons for a schedule change
 - Student was moved from waitlist
 - Reconsider taking a course
 - Grade concern
- Last day for schedule changes is **May 15**
 - W and WF Policy
- Schedules mailed in summer are FINAL

- Size of College
- Geographic Location
- Academic Programs
- Social and Spiritual
 - **Atmosphere**
- Sports

Cost of College

- Learn as much as you can about cost of college and financial aid
 - Go to studentaid.gov/aid-estimator/ to get an estimate of Federal Student Aid (Expected Family Contribution)
 - Research financial aid/scholarships at the college(s) your daughter is considering and use the net price calculator
 - Western Undergraduate Exchange (WUE) Scholarship <u>www.wiche.edu/wue</u>

What is Demonstrated Interest?

- Open emails from colleges and click on links
- Attend virtual or in-person college events hosted in our area (if possible/safe)
- Take virtual college tours
- Join mailing lists
- Correspond with admissions representatives
- Visit colleges in person, take official tours, and opt for interviews (if offered)
- Follow the college's official social media accounts

Most public universities do not consider Demonstrated Interest Critical Tip:
According to
college admissions
directors, colleges
often subtract
"interest points"
when parents
contact admissions
of their student.

Testing Update



- UC + many West coastschools = Test Free
- CSU = Test Free
- ²/₃ of all colleges and universities in the U.S. = Test Optional or Test Free
- Check college websites for updated information

Use a Dedicated College Email Account!

- Ensure that your daughter has a professional email for college use.
- D0 NOT use Troubiemail!
- Keep track of usernames and passwords.

Social Security Number and Name

This is important!

Here is your homework:

Check your daughter's Social Security card and verify her formal name.

Formal Name

- SFHS Transcript
- Standardized Testing
- College Applications
- Financial Aid
- Scholarships

Ensure that she uses her formal name for all of these documents.

Grade Point Average



- How the SFHS GPA is calculated:
 - Includes all classes except PE/Sports, Student Intern or Academic Teams
 - Honors and AP classes will receive an additional grade point.

 SFHS will report the weighted, 6-semester GPA if requested by a college.

- Note: Many colleges will recalculate during the application process.
 - UC & CSU only use a-g courses from Sophomore and Junior year.
 - UNR only uses English, Math, Science, & Social Studies in their GPA calculation.
- SFHS is a non-rank school.
 - St. Francis has a rigorous college preparatory program; therefore, a cumulative ranking system based on GPA does not fairly represent a student's relative achievement.
