General Summary

What is the primary purpose of this position?

Working with administrators, faculty, and staff, the Engagement and Inclusion Specialist at St. Francis Catholic High School is responsible for identifying needs, promoting honest discussion of racial diversity issues, and regularly exercises discretion and independent judgment to initiate the steps needed to sustain an inclusive, welcoming community, consistent with the mission of the school. The Engagement and Inclusion Specialist will continue the vision and strategy already in place that champions the importance and value of a diverse and inclusive community. This position will directly support the Principal and will further engage administration, faculty, staff, and students to build a welcoming and inclusive culture at SFHS. This position will serve as an advisor and resource for the Executive Team, Administration, Faculty, Staff, and Students in the areas of diversity, equity, and inclusion. The Engagement and Inclusion Specialist, under only general supervision, will design training initiatives on cultural competency and other topics designed to increase awareness and support of equity and inclusion in keeping with Catholic Church teaching. This is a full-time, exempt position.

Essential Responsibilities

- Serves as consultant and resource to students and faculty on a range of strategies, opportunities and initiatives that will further diversity and inclusion within the SFHS community;
- Assists the leadership in aligning the school's practices in the areas of diversity, equity, and inclusion with our identity as a Diocesan Catholic school;
- Under only general supervision, develops programs and processes to promote diversity and inclusion throughout the community;
- Builds authentic and collaborative working relationships with external diverse communities and stakeholders. Introduces school leadership to minority community leaders and groups;
- Works with administration to improve effectiveness and success in the recruitment and retention of a diverse faculty and staff;



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- Assists and advises leadership in creating and sustaining an environment which fosters
 a respect for the integration of diverse students into the academic, co-curricular,
 athletic, spiritual, and social areas of the school;
- Works with Admissions office to recruit, welcome, and retain students from diverse backgrounds;
- Works with Campus Ministry on ways to contribute to the spiritual values and activities of the school;
- Under only general supervision, plans, develops, and markets inclusion-focused education, programs, and events for staff, students, and parents;
- Independently plans and coordinates professional development focused on faculty growth in understanding the role of social and cultural factors in both learning and teaching;
- Provides individual and personalized coaching to faculty, staff, and students to increase cultural awareness, following the Racial Reconciliation Plan and Restorative Justice Program as necessary;
- Assists in the facilitation and implementation of cultural competency training for faculty and staff;
- Supports and develops student leadership in matters related to diversity, equity, and inclusion;
- Exercises discretion in the design and delivery of Engagement and Inclusion assemblies throughout the school year (approximately one per quarter);
- Independently designs and delivers Lunch and Learn sessions for deeper discussion and understanding for students, faculty, and staff;
- Serves as mediator/facilitator of diversity-centered student conflicts;
- Collaborates with counseling staff on methods of appropriate intervention as it pertains to diverse groups within the SFHS community;
- Supports Parent Groups of underrepresented students and assists them in creating community. Uses independent judgment to determine and deliver appropriate specific cultural experiences for them so that they and their students feel included in the SFHS community;
- Partners with faculty across all grade levels to promote greater emphasis on multicultural education;
- Researches and identifies current and emerging issues, trends and opportunities in the area of diversity, equity, and inclusion.
