Grade Point Average:

A semester grade point average is calculated by finding the sum of the grade points (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1) divided by the total number of courses taken in that semester. PE, Student Intern, Athletics, and Academic Teams do not receive grade points and are not calculated into the GPA. Honors and AP courses are weighted with 1 additional grade point per semester (A=5, B=4, C=3). Additional grade points are not awarded when a student earns a grade of D.

Credits:

A full-time student earns 30 credits per semester (6 courses). Seniors graduate with a minimum of 240 credits. An F grade receives no credit, therefore the course must be repeated the following year or in summer school. With prior permission from SFHS administration, courses taken at other accredited high schools will be posted to the transcript. Courses in English, Theology, and Social Studies must be taken at SFHS. SFHS does not post online courses or college courses on the transcript.
