SFHS Class of 2018

- ▶ 20% to California State University (was 23% in 2017)
- ▶ 9% to University of California
- ▶ 17% to California Private Colleges
- ▶ 18% to Out-of-state Public
- ▶ 24% to Out-of-state Private (was 18% in 2016)
- ▶ 10% to Community colleges
- ▶ 2 students to a Military Academy
- ▶ 1 student studying Internationally

Our students attend over 90 different colleges throughout the world.

Where Should She Apply?

Apply broadly to a range of schools with different academic profiles and cost

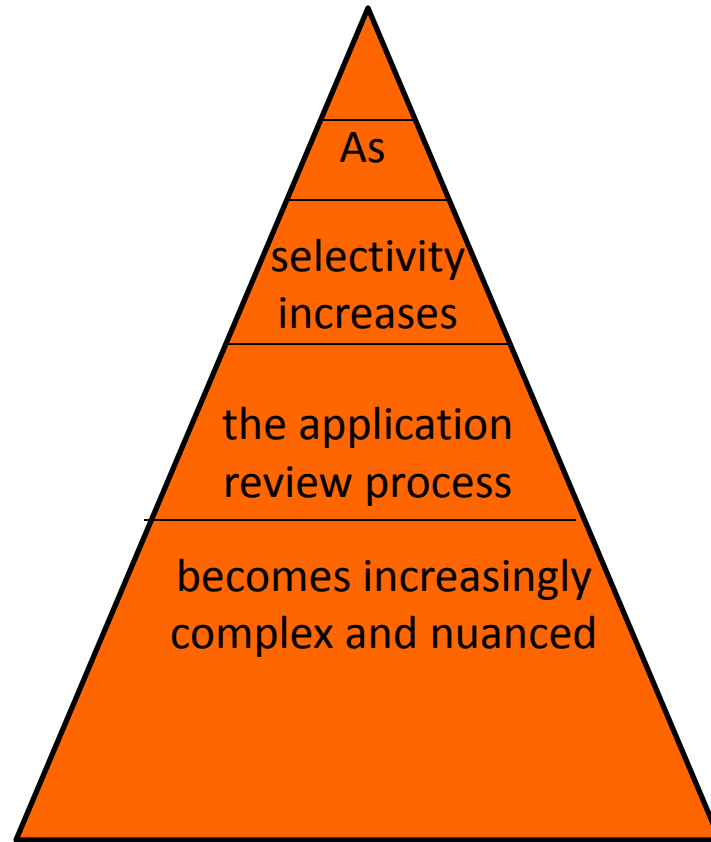
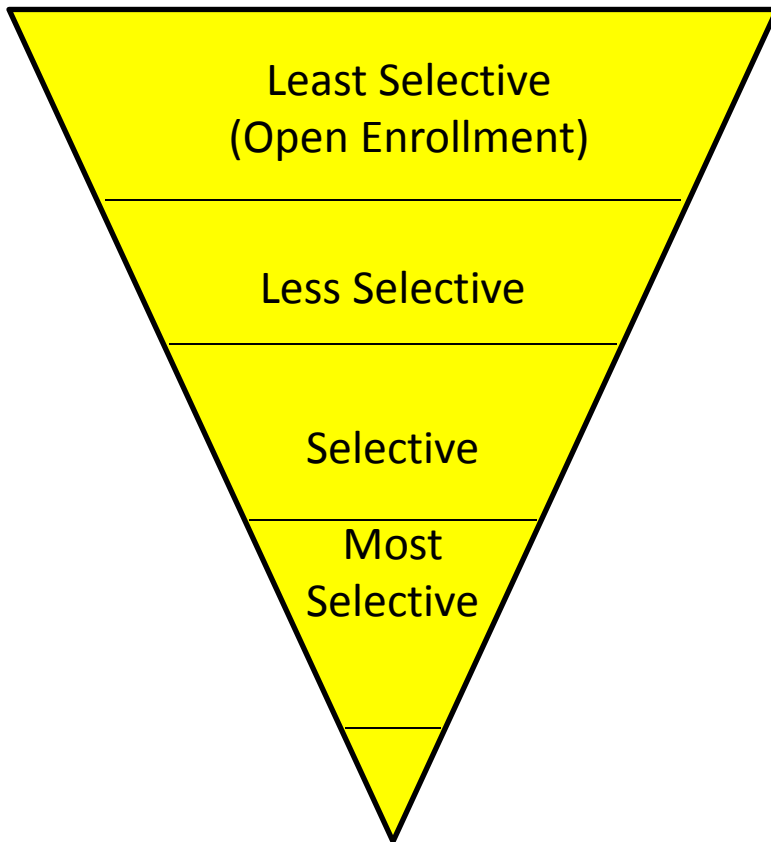
- **Reach:**
 - Any school that accepts less than 25% of applicants
 - Financial reach
 - School that exceeds student's profile (GPA, test scores)
- **Realistic :** You fit the profile of an admitted student
 - Most of your applications should fit into this category
- **Likely:** A school where you know you'll be admitted and you can afford
- ALL should be “first choice” schools
- More is not better

“Lottery schools”

- Regardless of a student’s academic profile, the most selective schools in the United States are “lottery” schools.

– Stanford	4.30%	47,450/2,040
– Harvard	4.59%	42,742/1,962
– UCLA	14%	113,748/16,020

The Selectivity Funnel



How to Demonstrate Your Interest

- Be aware of the opportunities that exist to engage with the schools high on your list
- Visit colleges and take official tour or attend admissions session
- Meet with college representatives when they visit SFHS
- Attend college fairs, events, and receptions
- Open emails and click on links
 - Check “promotions” tab in gmail

Options for Applying

- Regular Decision
- Rolling Admission
- Early Action
- Restrictive/Single Choice Early Action
- Early Decision 1 & 2

If they are applying early request letters of recommendation ASAP and/or by Oct. 2 from your SF College Advisor and teacher.

Applying

- Student Name
 - When completing application, student's name should match with social security card and transcript
- Passwords/Log-ins
 - Student should keep a log of ALL passwords and log-ins
- College Portals
 - Student needs to check their college portals frequently for updates about their application status
- Student should check “college” e-mail frequently

GPA, Deciles & Profile

- How is the SF GPA calculated?
 - All classes except PE/Sports, Student Intern, Academic Teams
 - Honors/AP courses get an additional point towards the GPA if the grade is C or higher
- What do we report to colleges?
 - 6 semesters + summer school; weighted GPA (unweighted GPA is on transcript as well)
 - Student deciles
 - First decile = Top 10%, Second decile=Top 20%, etc.
- School Profile

Essay/Insight Questions

- Should be in their own voice
- Counselor and College Advisor Assistance
 - Print essay and put in box in Guidance (on Mrs. Rivera's desk) or share google doc with us
- More feedback is not better
 - Do not ask 5 people for feedback at the same time

Submitting Transcripts

- Electronically Uploaded by College Advisor
- US Mail – sent by Student
 - Complete request form and submit to Mrs. Rivera in Guidance with a stamped & addressed envelope
 - Student picks up sealed envelope and puts in U.S. Mail
- Transcripts are NOT requested in Naviance and are NOT requested on the SF website

ACT & SAT – Sending Scores

- Test scores need to be **requested by the student** through ACT and College Board (SAT) and sent directly to each school that requires official scores
- Test scores should arrive by the application due date (allow 2 weeks)
- **CSU:** use the *CSU Systemwide Institution Code: 3594* for sending SAT scores to ALL CSU campuses; send ACT to ONE campus and all campuses can access scores
- **UC:** send ACT or SAT scores to ONE campus and all campuses can access scores

- Method Test Prep – free for all SF students
- ACT Academy – ACT Prep
 - act.org/academy
- Khan Academy – SAT Prep
 - collegeboard.org
- SFHS's SAT Math Refresher Courses for the October & November SAT

University of California

- Apply Nov. 1 – 30 only (application is open)
- ucal.us/apply
- 1 application for all 9 campuses
- \$70 per campus application fee
- ACT with Writing or SAT with Essay
- 4 personal insight questions required
- No letters of recommendation or transcripts
 - Exception: possible UC Berkeley recommendation or UCLA/UC Irvine Nursing recommendation
- **SFHS Students DO NOT have a CA SSID**

California State University

- Apply Oct. 1 – Nov. 30
- calstate.edu/apply
- NEW! 1 application for all 23 campuses
- Most campuses use regional admission
 - Your guarantee is only with your regional campus
- \$55/campus application fee
- ACT or SAT required
- No essay, activities can be listed but not all schools look at them
- No letters of recommendation or transcripts

Community College

- Admission is open to high school graduates and/or students who are 18 years or older. No test scores required
- AP credit is offered at the Community College for most scores of 3 and above
- Community College Transfers are given priority admissions to CSU's and UC's
 - Associates Degree for Transfers (ADT) - guarantee to CSU
 - Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) - guarantee to UC (6 campuses)
- Some CCC's offer on-campus housing and shared housing with local universities
- Stay tuned for Community College Week at St. Francis!

Private Colleges

- Application deadlines vary
- Essay & transcript usually required
- College Advisor & 1 – 2 teacher recommendations required (maximum)
- Waiving Rights to Access (FERPA)

The Common Application

- www.commonapp.org over 700 schools
- Many colleges have supplements
 - Additional essays or questions
- Students “invite” College Advisor & teacher/s to recommend them
- Submit each application w/supplements separately
- \$0 - \$90/campus application fee
- Common App vs. College Priority App etc.

Out-of-State Public

Process Varies

- Application Deadlines
- Admission Requirements
- Requirements for Letters of Recommendation
- Requirements for Transcripts
- Essay Requirements

Some are now on the Common Application

After You Apply & Outcomes

- Check college portals and personal e-mail
 - Check “promotions” tab in gmail
- Check regular mail
- Possible outcomes:
 - Admitted
 - Deferred (for early action/early decision apps)
 - Denied
 - Waitlisted
 - Spring semester admission
- Must make decision and submit Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) by May 1
National College Signing Day

Estimated Total Cost of College (per year)

- USC & NYU >\$75,000
- U of San Diego >\$65,000
- U of Oregon >49,000
- UC San Diego >\$35,000
- Cal Poly >\$25,000
- Sac State >\$7,000 (live at home)
- Community College - tuition FREE (live at home)

Financial Aid

- FAFSA complete Oct. 1 – March 2
 - “Free Application for Federal Student Aid”
 - fafsa.ed.gov
 - Need FSA ID (student and parent)
 - FAFSA will use 2017 income information
- Used to determine EFC (Expected Family Contribution) and to award federal and state aid
- Complete Cal Grant GPA Release Form to be considered for Cal Grant ASAP (by Nov. 30)

Financial Aid

- CSS Profile
 - profileonline.collegeboard.com
- Used by many private schools to determine eligibility for institutional aid (check list on website listed above)
- Some schools have early deadlines (Early Action deadline)
- Check with each school for requirements and deadlines

Naviance

- College search & Scattergrams
- Students can sign-up for college rep visits
- Add the colleges student is applying to in Naviance
- Keep Naviance updated with application status (admitted, deferred, denied, waitlisted)
- Enter scholarships received w/4-year total \$\$
 - These will be printed (without \$\$) in the Awards Assembly and Graduation programs

Tips for Your Daughter

- Set aside time each week to work on college applications.
- Seek advice from your College Advisor and not your friends.
- Remember that your test scores are only one factor in your application.
- Highlight your strengths!
- Stay ahead of deadlines. Procrastination leads to stress.
- Remember “Who You Are.” College acceptances do not define you.
- Remember that no one can control their college admissions outcomes.
- Be prayerful and trust that God’s good plans await you!

Tips for Parents

- Encourage your daughter to apply to a wide range of colleges.
- Take regular breaks from “college talk” at home.
- Allow your daughter the independence to come to you when she needs help.
- Be clear and upfront about **location** and **costs of college** that are acceptable.
- Listen and offer advice when asked.
- Remind her to anticipate deadlines.
- Encourage her to see her College Advisor.
