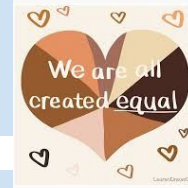
Girls for Human Rights:

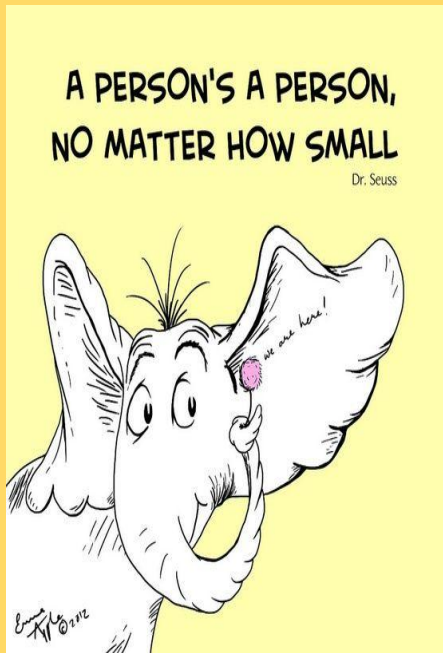

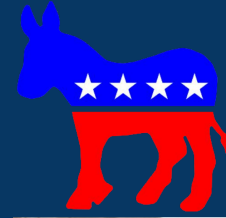

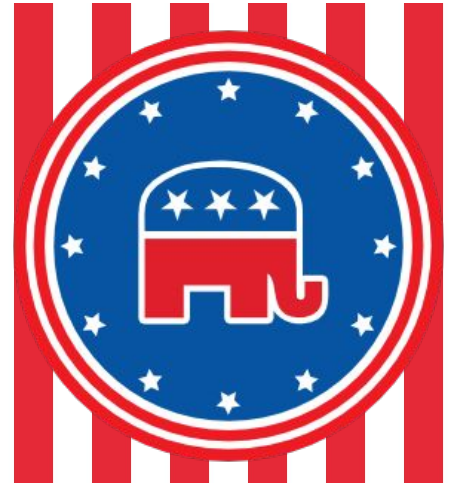
Young Republicans
