## Changes to Dance Policy

policy was changed.

In the past, St. Francis High School followed a strict dance policy which prohibited students from bringing female guests to school events. In the “Dances” section of the 2018-2019 Student-Parent Handbook, the Date Policy states, “For the Homecoming Dance, Senior Ball, Junior Prom, and Frosh/Soph Formal, students may choose to bring a male date or to come alone” (emphasis added). Anne Ayotte '19 saw this rule and sought out to alter it to include all students here at St. Francis regardless of their background or beliefs. Anne was able to successfully change the dance policy. Effective immediately, St. Francis students are allowed to bring any guest of their choice--male or female. We interviewed Ann, who was responsible for bringing positive change to our campus.

Read this interview below:

**Jahnavi Mehta:** What was your reaction when you first came across the previous dance policy?

**Ann Ayotte:** I was upset because I felt that the policy discriminated against LGBTQ+ people and unnecessarily prohibited students from bringing female friends.

**JM:** Did anyone influence your decision to work for this policy to be changed? Please explain the process by which you were able to change this policy.

**AA:** Yes, my friend at Jesuit told me that the policy had changed there and they were allowed to bring anyone to dances. I then decided that I also wanted to change the policy at SF. I talked to my parents and friend Sydney Galvan '19 about it and they both supported me. Sydney also wrote a letter in support of the policy and a reflection on her time at SF and how it could become better with a change of policy. I wrote the proposal last semester but didn't submit it to Mr. Mendoza, Mrs. Rodgers, and Mrs. Cost until January. A few months later, I was emailed by Mrs. McGreevy that the

**JM:** In what way does this new dance policy re-inforce Church teaching on social justice and the dignity of the person?

**AA:** I think this policy definitely reinforces the Church's teachings. In my paper I talked about how the Pope believes in integrating all people into the Church, regardless of sexual orientation. By doing this, I believe the dance policy treats all people with equal dignity.

**JM:** Why did you feel that this policy needed to be changed?

**AA:** I thought it needed to be changed because I believed students should be able to take anybody they wanted to a dance, regardless of gender. If students are going to have fun bringing a female friend, they should also have the option to do so. I support all LGBTQ+ people and believed that the dance policy could be improved to better incorporate them into SF dances.

**JM:** What major points did you use to persuade administration to change this long-standing policy?

**AA:** I quoted the Pope several times, including one brief conversation he had with a gay man stating, “God made you like this. God loves you like this. The Pope loves you like this and you should love yourself and not worry about what people say.” I quoted the SF website which talked about incorporating diversity among students. I also talked about how SF supports the dignity of all people, and should therefore change the policy to better support all students. Finally, I talked about the wellness of LGBTQ+ students. LGBTQ+ students are far more likely to struggle with mental health issues. I believe that the dance policy change better supports LGBTQ+ students and gives them better opportunity to be supported in their wellness.

**JM:** Is there anything you want SF students to know?

**AA:** If you are a member of the LGBTQ+ community, I support you and want you to know that you are important and loved. I try my best to be an ally and will support you here at SF and outside of school. I also want to thank the St. Francis faculty and staff who agreed to change the dance-guest policy. I am thankful for all the teachers who supported this change and I believe that as a result St. Francis has become a more welcoming and loving place.


Soon, October was just around the corner and life became crazier. Homecoming Week was stressful, as it usually is, and student council spent hours

# 2019 Arts Recap

This has been a memorable year for the arts! The school year started in the fall with the captivating *Chicago: High School Edition* performance. Later in the year, the SF Players class performed their student-curated act named “girl”, depicting what life is like in modern America. After winning the Bronze Award at Lenaea Theatre Festival, the show came back for another performance due to popular demand! This year is also Ms. Watson’s final year at St. Francis, so we asked her some questions about her time here! *Quilters*, which took place in March, was her last show. It was based on the book *The Quilters: Women and Domestic Art* and features a series of short tales with musical numbers. Each piece serves as a representation of a different aspect of either frontier life or womanhood. The Spring Dance Showcase: “The Final Works” premiered on April 11. Spring Music Concert took place on May 4, 2019. Read the interview below:

**Francesca Chang:** What is your official title and how long have you been working at St. Francis?

**Cheryl Watson:** My official title is Chairman of the Performing Arts, Department Chairman, and also the Theatre Director, and I’m finishing my 34th year. It’s my last year because I’m retiring at the end of the year.

**FC:** Which part of your job do you enjoy the most?

**CW:** Well, I have to say working with students. That’s what gets me going in the morning and gets me here, so I really enjoy the classroom experience. I also have enjoyed directing the musicals and the plays and really seeing the growth, artistically and as humans, of the girls as they go through the four years they’re here.

**FC:** What is your favorite performance that you have worked on or with during your time here?

**CW:** I don’t really have a favorite. I have great memories from almost every production I’ve done. I think there’d be a general moment - would be the camaraderie and the way the cast feels when they’re working together, but I think I love every single play because every single play had a special significance with a student or seeing a student grow in a part, even if the play wasn’t as successful as other ones, it still has a great memory for me. I feel like if I chose a favorite, it’s like choosing a favorite child, and I don’t think I could do that. I have two children and three grandchildren, and I’m not going to choose a favorite, so I really can’t answer that except to say that my favorite moment has always been seeing the light bulb go off when a student or the cast gets the idea and you can see the play kind of forming. That’s always an exciting time.

**FC:** What was your favorite part of this year?

**CW:** I think that my favorite part of this year has been two-fold: one, we started an honors program and we

just finished something with our capstone projects, which turned out beautifully. It made me very nostalgic because a lot of these girls have been in my class for four years and to see their growth as an artist was very fulfilling. I’ve enjoyed, of course, directing the plays and going to Lenaea, but I’ve also enjoyed very much this year, and it’s been very memorable to me that the woman that’s taking over the drama program, Kiera Anderson, is a former student of mine. She went four years here. To see how well-suited she is for this job and to see how well-respected and loved she is by the students and also working with her on our final project for the Lenaea Festival this year and doing something together and working on *Chicago* together in the fall-- it was very joyous for me to know that the department is in such great hands and that she is going to bring her gifts, but I guess that’s a big part of the fear you have when you love a job so much and you have to leave is what’s going to happen to it and the fact that I don’t really have that fear - I just have respect and excitement to see what happens next.

**FC:** What are your plans after St. Francis?

**CW:** Well, immediately, in August, I’m going to Hawaii. I don’t really know. I do want to continue in theatre. I would like to do a little more acting. I used to act a lot, and I haven’t been able to that because it’s so time-consuming with all the work that we do here, especially with rehearsals. I’m going to be directing again at the Woodland Opera House. I’ve directed there a few times, and I really like it. I am going to investigate ways in which I can still stay involved in theatre and work with adults. I taught at college for eleven years also while I was a teacher here, and I did enjoy working with adults in acting classes. I don’t know exactly where it’s going to lead me. I’m definitely going to have more time to explore things that I want to do that’s kind of - not selfish, but it’s more directed about the next journey that I want to take. So, I’m going to stay involved in theatre, probably working in different theatres and spending more time with my grandchildren. My granddaughter - she’s only ten months old - she lives in Los Angeles with her parents, so it gives me more flexibility to visit her and then my two grandsons are here, so spend more time with my family and friends and appreciate time.

**FC:** Where do you get most of your inspiration from, either in your personal life or in your career?

**CW:** I think because theatre is a collaborative medium, it takes more than just one person; I’m always inspired by the people who I work with, whether it’s my students or professional production staff or my fellow teachers here, that really the inspiration comes from - this is going to sound very lofty, but from the St. Francis community and from my students. And also, there’s an inspiration I think for artists on a spiritual level, so I would be remiss if I didn’t say that some of my inspiration from things I’ve done in my life have come

from God, because I feel like we’re all vessels, and He brings the best out and if we open our hearts, because of a strong faith, it brings the best out in you, so I like to think that humanity inspires me and a strong faith.

We wish Ms. Watson the best luck in her future endeavours, and good luck to Ms. Anderson in the following years!
